BIOGRAPHY

Paul qualified as a Social Worker in 1998 and has since completed his Post Qualification Award. Prior to qualification, Paul managed a charity supporting people with disabilities. The ethos of the organisation was to assist people with physical and cognitive disabilities to become better integrated into mainstream living. The majority of the organisations staff were people with disabilities. As well as recruitment, training and support of staff, Paul was responsible for the development of the organisation's range of services to enhance social integration.

During his training, Paul was employed by Haywards Heath Social Services as an agency trainee social worker within the Adult and then, Children's and Families team. During this period Paul gained experience of completing initial referral assessments and the reviewing of established care plans.

Following qualification Paul was employed by Oxfordshire Social Services as a social worker initially within the Adult Disability team. To enhance his experience and knowledge Paul also arranged to be seconded to the children and families and learning disabilities team.

Paul then gained experience of working in the following client settings, adults and children with physical disabilities, clients with mental health, learning difficulties, alcohol and drug addictions and carer support. Working within these client groups, Paul gained considerable experience in undertaking full assessments, planning, implementing and reviewing care plans, supporting complex cases, crisis intervention and when necessary following and actioning safeguarding procedures.

Paul developed an interest in working with younger disabled individuals who have spinal cord injuries, degenerative conditions and acquired brain injury. Paul further developed this interest by his involvement in the establishment of a specialist support service for young adults with head injuries, an activity programme for young clients with challenging behaviour issues and a young carers' support project.

In 2001 Paul was employed by Reading Social Services as a Locality Team Manager. This post involved recruiting and managing multi-disciplinary teams, budget and resource management, implementing service plans and audit control. Paul also had lead responsibility for the development of the local direct payment and independent living fund schemes. Paul also worked closely with local GP surgeries to establish a joint health and social assessment tool.

Since 2004 Paul has worked as a case manager with Brownbill Associates. As a case manager, Paul has extensive experience of working with clients with, spinal cord injuries, acquired brain injuries, sensory disabilities and children with cerebral palsy. Paul has been able to utilise his social work management background in the establishment of multi-disciplinary health professional therapeutic teams, the recruitment and management of support worker teams, and working closely with clients to specific independent living and rehabilitation goals.

With his social work background Paul has a particular interest and is skilled at working with children with significant health and social care needs within families with complex dynamics. He also has considerable experience of providing case management report and court statements within the context of personal injury litigation.
