Rosie began her career as a support worker for adults with learning disabilities in both day centre and residential settings. She soon moved into rehabilitation support assisting occupational therapists and physiotherapists implementing rehabilitation programmes with clients with various conditions, including stroke and multiple sclerosis.

After working as an assistant to Occupational Therapists and Social Workers with the City of Edinburgh Council, Rosie completed a BSc in Occupational Therapy in 2006. Her first professional role was hospital based and included assessing, planning and implementing treatment programmes, this built on her experience of multidisciplinary working. Rosie was also responsible for pre-discharge assessments and discharge planning.

Rosie progressed to community Occupational Therapist for the City of Edinburgh Council and it was here that Rosie built up her experience of case management working with clients with complex needs, working across professional boundaries and linking with a range of agencies to ensure all client's needs were met.

Rosie began working with JSP in November 2013 as an independent Occupational Therapist. She joined the team full time as Case Manager in May 2015, became a Senior Case Manager in 2017 and an Advanced Practitioner with BABICM in 2018.
