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Experience

Leanie provides case management services to individuals with complex injury and rehabilitation needs. Her role involves identifying rehabilitation needs, facilitating access to appropriate services and supporting individuals to achieve meaningful goals, including community participation, education and return to employment where appropriate.

Leanie has worked in case management since 2018, and in previous roles progressed through several senior positions, ultimately becoming Rehabilitation Lead. Alongside managing a complex caseloads she provided leadership and support to fellow Case Managers, overseeing clinical quality, safeguarding, supervision and service development. She was responsible for undertaking Immediate Needs Assessments, coordinating multidisciplinary rehabilitation programmes and working closely with solicitors, insurers, healthcare professionals and statutory services to achieve positive outcomes. During this time, Leanie developed extensive experience supporting individuals with acquired brain injury, traumatic brain injury, neurological conditions, chronic pain, orthopaedic injuries, psychological trauma and complex rehabilitation needs.

Prior to moving into case management, Leanie graduated in Occupational Therapy in 2010 and gained extensive experience as an Occupational Therapist across NHS inpatient, community rehabilitation, social work and reablement services. She supported individuals presenting with complex medical, physical, psychological, neurological and functional rehabilitation needs, helping them maximise independence and safely participate in daily life. Her work included rehabilitation following illness, injury and surgery, complex discharge planning, equipment and adaptation assessments, assistive technology provision and multidisciplinary rehabilitation. Through her social work and community care roles, she worked closely alongside social workers to undertake Self-Directed Support assessments, coordinate complex care planning and commission community-based support and care services. Leanie has significant experience supporting adults with safeguarding concerns and has been actively involved in Adult Support and Protection processes, working collaboratively with statutory agencies and multidisciplinary teams to manage risk whilst promoting autonomy and independence. Her background provides a strong understanding of both health and social care systems, enabling her to effectively coordinate rehabilitation and support individuals with complex needs in community settings.
